Titles are in *italics* when attributed, "enquoted" when assigned by and editor or translator, and roman when unattributed.

biblatex-sbl adopts this format even when it departs from the blog or handbook.

- The blog tends to prefer for text collections cited by abbreviation to appear in a list of abbreviations rather than in the bibliography.
- The blog helps considerably with citations in this section, but there are still some ambiguities for someone who is not familiar with the texts in question.
- Some adjustment will likely be needed to get the output suitable for your particular work. Most things are possible.
